Founded in 2007, HopeNow is a grassroots NGO specializing in confidential services for migrants, both documented and undocumented. With two decades of experience, we excel in tackling human trafficking and assisting vulnerable individuals in prisons and detention centers.

Serving as cultural mediators, we act as a vital link between these people and the Danish authorities, fostering understanding and building bridges.

HopeNow works closely with Danish authorities, such as the Center Against Human Trafficking (CMM) to combat human trafficking.

We are one of three NGOs working together under the National Action Plan to Combat Trafficking in Human Beings, conducting outreach to locate individuals with signs of human trafficking.

We strictly adhere to the principle of confidentiality. We never share any information without your express verbal and written consent.

Our Services

✔ SUPPORT FOR HEALTH NEEDS

HopeNow offers a wide range of support services to individuals in need. This includes communal cooking and eating facilities, trauma counseling, food packs, medicine, luggage assistance, medical tests, over-the-counter medication, clothes, travel card top-ups, hospital visits, and referrals to other service providers.

✔ COUNSELLING AND 24/7 HOTLINE SUPPORT

We have a 24/7 hotline providing counselling, supportive/therapeutic/legal guidance, and information on state services. We have managed to step in in emergencies and help desperate people who need acute help.

✔ PRISON VISITS, ONLINE AND TELEPHONE COUNSELLING

We offer continuous support and therapeutic counseling to trafficked individuals and vulnerable persons who are incarcerated, including those facing long-term imprisonment.

✔ COOPERATION WITH PARTNERS

We aim to provide comprehensive support to undocumented migrants. In addition to our services, we cooperate with specialized lawyers and NGO's Reden International, Ami Ami and the Red Cross. We also cooperate with Center Mod Menneskehandel (a government organisation that coordinates efforts to combat human trafficking).



Trustbased Outreach

HopeNow conducts outreach social work in various environments such as streets, parks, prisons, asylum centers and detention centers.

HopeNow works closely with the Center Against Human Trafficking (CMM) to combat human trafficking. CMM coordinates the Danish efforts, including knowledge gathering, statistics and social support for victims.

Our target group is male and female victims of human trafficking and their families, including vulnerable undocumented and documented migrants.

We offer advice and support to facilitate rehabilitation and repatriation in their home countries.
